Two apartment projects are next on the construction schedule for the Compton Village when approval area which should be 70 per cent completed next year, City Planner David C. Neville said yesterday.

The whole village will be completed in four years, Neville added at the regular meeting of the City Planning Commission.

Wilmington Reserve Authority will build a 100-unit apartment project for the low-income elderly for the Wilmington Housing Authority and a four-story project for elderly persons of moderate income.

Neville said proposals for the federal building at 8th and King Sts. appear bright in Congress with the nearby city and state buildings due for a construction start in two years and completion in four.
